8/6/2014 at 15:20, on location. Met with facility personnel familiar with incident. According to personnel, jogger along Highway 1806 noticed natural gas smell and, due to proximity to Hess facility, notified personnel there. On western shoulder of 1806 directly west of Hess Hawkeye Compressor Station, natural gas was coming up through a crack in the pavement of the shoulder. No vegetation is growing nearby as it is also the location of a gravel turnoff to a farmer's grain bins. Line was shut down and will be disconnected on eastern side of the highway. Line cannot be disconnected from the compressor station as it is still fueling a home located between the highway and the compressor station.
