## Cause of Incident:

Tanker traveling north on Hwy 22 slowing down to turn left on to Bia 30 negotiated the turn incorrectly and caught the front tires off the flat surface and on the slope which in turn caused the tanker to travel further down the slope until the truck could no longer hold its upright position and rolled over on its side and came to a stop

When the accident happened another tanker was coming the opposite direction, he immediately hooked his vacuum lines to the turned over tanker and pulled all the produced water from the damaged vessel. After the vessel was emptied he vacuumed the ponded water that had escaped out of the turned over tanker.

disposal, Enerplus Bear Den Salt Water Disposal.
