Hunter Hubrig, Cass County Emergency Coordinator, contacted Kris Roberts and me through email and then by phone to provide an update on the cleanup of the site. Mr Hubrig said Roger Bischof informed him that American Enterprises, Inc. scraped up the soil on April 22 and has been holding it at its facility on a truck. Terracon is testing the soil now to correctly determine disposal location. American Enterprises, Inc. expressed hope that soil could be disposed of at its own landfill in West Fargo.

Disposal of the soil will be determined when the soil test results come back from Terracon.
