Single truck accident. Driver veered near edge of road when passing oncoming vehicle, and wheel caught edge of road and truck went over on its side into ditch.

Soil impacted, no waterways near spilled fuel, berm set up until excavation can begin.

Action Taken or Planned:

Clean up company called to contain spill which ran along ditch under oilfield water line. Soil will be excavated after water line is removed, in the meantime, clean up company set up a berm to ensure no further fuel spread. No homes nearby, only encroached about 4 feet into adjacent farmland.

Wastes Disposal Location: Clean up company will haul waste to proper disposal site, expected to be Clean Harbors.

On site 11/07/16 at 1:40 p.m. Mostly cloudy, 55 degrees F, wind 7 mph south. While on site, a rep from Northwest Water Transfer stopped by. They currently have a freshwater line extending for a few miles to a Liberty well which is being fracked. This line runs directly adjacent to the spill area. Spoke to Rolfson rep at 5 p.m. on the phone. Rolfson had contracted Strata to clean up the spill, but there is concern over damaging the water line so they are waiting approximately another week and a half for cleanup. Discussed NDDoH concerns that diesel may be leaching further into the soil. Rolfson will contact Strata to discuss and try and expedite cleanup.

8:00 a.m. 11.14.16 - Spoke to Scott with Strata. Discussed concerns that material may further leach into the soil if they wait to clean up. They are waiting because they are worried about puncturing a fracking water line adjacent to the spill; they are unable to move the line as is. He said the line should be moved by the end of the week, and Strata will go in to clean up as soon as they can. He dug three holes, and it appeared contamination reached down 16 inches. No liquid pooled into the holes he dug. They will update the NDDoH on cleanup.
