Speaker Biographies

Rachel Birk, M.S.

Rachel Birk is the tuberculosis coordinator/HIV surveillance coordinator for the North Dakota Department of Health, Division of Disease Control. Rachel earned a bachelor's degree in microbiology from the University of Missouri-Columbia and master's degree in microbiology from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Julie Wagendorf, M.S.

Julie Wagendorf was born in Hettinger, N.D. She graduated from North Dakota State University in Fargo, N.D., earning a bachelor of science degree in microbiology, minor in chemistry and a master of science degree in microbiology. She has worked with the Division of Disease Control at the North Dakota Department of Health for eight years as a surveillance epidemiologist and has been the STD/Hepatitis Program Manager since 2008.

Sarah Weninger

Sarah Weninger is the adult viral hepatitis prevention coordinator with the North Dakota Department of Health, Division of Disease Control. Dr. John Hagan, M.D.
