EMS INSTRUCTOR - COORDINATOR COURSE

Course Information:

The EMS Instructor - Coordinator Course is designed to prepare instructor candidates to become competent "entry-level" EMS Instructors.

The course is based on the U.S. DOT 2002 National Guidelines for Educating EMS Instructors and is approved by the North Dakota Division of EMS & Trauma (Course # 118549-16-T001).

The course will utilize a variety of methods to present the necessary knowledge and skills required by a new EMS instructor teaching EMR or EMT courses.

- Pre-course reading assignments with on-line assessments.
- On-site presentations, group activities and role-playing.
- Post course submission of a developed lesson plan, evaluation instrument and video of presentation.

The minimum class hours are 40. The student will complete 20 of those hours on-site and the balance at their home or work.



Course Content:

Topics covered in the curriculum include:

- Administrative, Legal & Ethical issues
- Student Motivation and Learning Environments
- Adult Learning Styles
- Domains of Learning
- Using & Developing Lesson Plans
- Evaluation Techniques and Test Item Development
- Facilitation Techniques
- Communication & Feedback Techniques
- Teaching Critical Thinking & Psychomotor Skills
- Remediation and Discipline
- Instructional Resources
- North Dakota specific requirements and procedures
- Cultural Awareness

Eligibility and Registration:

The course is recommended for EMTs/AEMTs/Paramedics with 2 or more years of experience. A certificate will be awarded once all course requirements are successfully met. EMS Instructor/Coordinator status is issued by the ND Division of EMS & Trauma. The course does not qualify for EMS continuing education credits.

Cost of the course is \$450 which includes:

- Textbook and all pre-course study materials
- Snacks and drinks on both days of the class
- A collection of current EMS textbooks and resource materials from current EMS publishers.
