 - Mallory and Kristina shared a draft of a Gameboard and accompanying templates for Community Readiness Planning. The Gameboard would include activities for each community readiness level and what to focus on in that level. The template would include who to talk to, sample messaging and "asks" for community members.

• NSVRC Training

- CAWS and the NDDoH are planning to have NSVRC do a training/workshop March 27 or 28 in Bismarck on working with the media on sexual violence prevention. It was inspired by this recent resource from NSVRC https://www.nsvrc.org/moving-toward-prevention-guide-reframing-sexual-violence.
- The idea is to have participants walk away with useable messaging for SAAM. The workshop will be open to anyone interesting in working with the media or violence prevention messaging. Kristina will share the gameboard and templates with NSVRC to get input. The group wants to learn about how to counteract victim blaming and reframe messaging.

• Community Readiness Program Updates

- The group used a table and their readiness level scores to frame program updates.
- Mary Thysell (Level 3) Was doing Safe Dates in school before so working to get that going again. Talking about social norms. Suggested using YRBS when talking about local problem.

- O Darla Juma (Level 1) Giving out posters and brochures; doing 1:1 with churches and law enforcement; The 4th R; Thinking about Safe Dates for middle schools
- Lisa Weisz (Level 2-3) 10 sessions of Safe Dates; Love without Fear and SAAM coming up; wants to do something with sexual harassment; shadowed staff at CVIC
- Staci Jenkins 4-6 sessions of Safe Dates for 7-9 grades; Did newspaper ad with positive quotes; Looking at social media, sexting, and internet safety
- Peggy Jo Coll Spilling the Tea conversations; cookies with ribbons for stalking awareness month; Feb 14 Consent event; Action Week 1st week in April; Netflix series "You" is on stalking
- Melanie Fierstine (Level 3-4) Working with downtown group; Server trainings; GD
 Focus groups and preparing for October launch; Planting seeds of Green Dot in schools; RACC healthy relationships curriculum in schools
- Allison Burkman (Level 5-6) Green Dot Bystander Training; Partnering with Altru to co-coordinate and host another certification training in summer 2019
- Chris Douthit Revising Friendships that Work program to be more activity based;
 Athletes as Leaders; Surveying schools; seeing a lot of sexting
- Robert Davidson Race to Zero; Shared topics he uses during training (Terry Crews, Male to Male SA, and survivor statements); materials are on a CD and he is willing to share
