Conducting a Qualitative Interview – Tips

Qualitative Interviewing

- Different than quantitative interviews
 - Quantitative is about reading questions
 - Quantitative is making sure all interviews follow the same protocol
- Qualitative interviews are about *listening*
- Qualitative interviews can build on one another because they are meant to be exploratory

Interviewer Skills

Attentive

• Guide (Polite but firm)

Good communication skills

Comfortable with emotion

Interviewer Skills cont.

- Able to build rapport quickly
- Neutral
- Aware of body language
- Respectful

Preparation

- Put other thoughts aside
- Be familiar with consent form and interview guide
- Have two copies of the consent form
- Check equipment

Conducting the Interview

- Arrive on time and dress appropriately
- Explain the purpose of the interview
- Obtain written consent and permission to tape

Conducting the Interview cont.

• Build rapport

• Be thoughtful about self-disclosure

Ask questions if you do not understand

Conducting the Interview cont.

Stay on track

Use interviewee's language

Ask follow-up questions

Conducting the Interview cont.

- Don't lead with words or body language
- Close the Interview

 Remind interviewee about confidentiality and contact information

What to do if...

Non-responsive

- Crying
- Tangenting

What to do if...

Doesn't understand the question

Contradicting answers

They ask what you think

Confidentiality

Keeping information from interviews confidential
