


# National Standardized Child Passenger Safety Training Program



**Bismarck – April 28-May 1, 2008**  
**Grand Forks – May 19-22, 2008**  
**Fargo – June 23-26, 2008**  
**Minot – August 11-14, 2008**

## **The Problem**

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for young children. Nationally and in North Dakota, 90 percent of car seats are used incorrectly.

## **Who Should Attend**

Law enforcement, fire and EMS personnel, health-care professionals, car dealerships and other child passenger safety advocates. Participants need to be committed to child passenger safety.

## **Purpose**

This National Highway Traffic Safety Administration course will provide participants with the technical skills to identify and correct misuse of car seats, serve as a community child passenger safety resource, and educate others about child passenger safety.

Child passenger safety has become increasingly complex. There are many different child restraints and many different seat belt systems. All child restraints do not fit in all vehicles. The need for people with a high level of knowledge and a standardized set of qualifications has grown. This course will provide participants with the technical skills to:

- Identify and correct misuse of car safety seats.
- Serve as a community child passenger safety resource.
- Educate others about child passenger safety issues.
- Reduce potential liability through standardization.
- Receive knowledge and skills to meet national certification.

The course is taught through a combination of lectures, role-playing and extensive hands-on practice. It includes written and hands-on skills testing and concludes with a real-world community car safety seat checkup. Upon successful completion of this course, participants will become certified as child passenger safety technicians. The certification is valid for two years and is renewable.

# Registration

Registration for this course is a [two-step process](#), as follows:



## Step 1: Registration fee \$20.00:

## Step 2: Certification fee \$60.00:

Complete your application/registration online with **Safe Kids USA** by going to [www.usa.safekids.org](http://www.usa.safekids.org). To assist you with registration, please follow these suggestions. On the right side bar, click "CPS Certification." On the right side bar, click "find a course". Complete the "find a course" section. Select the location of the training you would like to attend and login to determine if you are eligible to register for the course. Follow directions to receive your username and continue to register. The preferred registration method is online with a credit card. However, you may print a hard copy of the registration form and send it with a check or purchase order. Follow the instructions on the website. The certification fee is \$60 for a two-year certification. All hard copy registrations must be **received** 10 business days before the start date of the course. Any registrations received after this date will be charged a \$10 late fee. Students can avoid this late fee by registering online by midnight of the first day of the course.

### Continuing Education Credits:

- ✓ Application for law enforcement post credits has been submitted.
- ✓ Application for contact hours has been made to Community Health Section, North Dakota Department of Health, an approved provider of continuing nursing education by CNE-Net, the education division of the North Dakota Nurses Association, an accredited approver by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation.
